

# EMPHATIC PRONOUN

Emphatic pronouns are pronouns that are used to emphasize or amplify a noun or a pronoun in a phrase. They are also known as intensive pronouns. These pronouns are created by prefixing some personal pronouns with “-self” when singular , or “-selves” when in plural.
