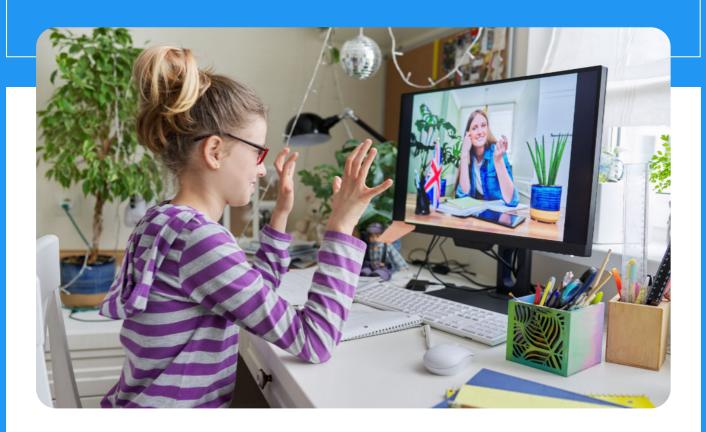


NEUTER
