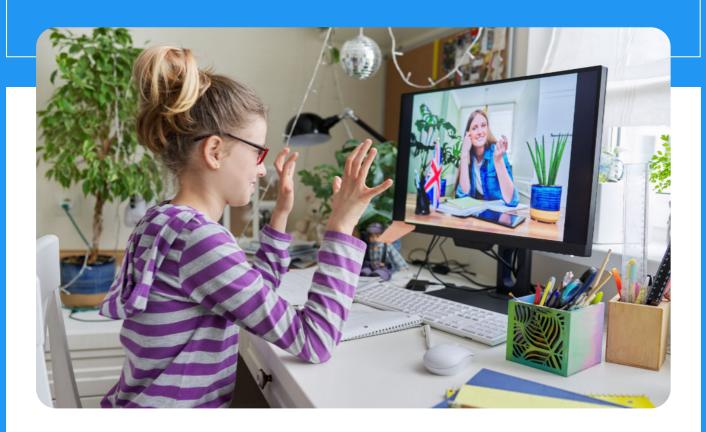


FUTURE PRESENT TENSE

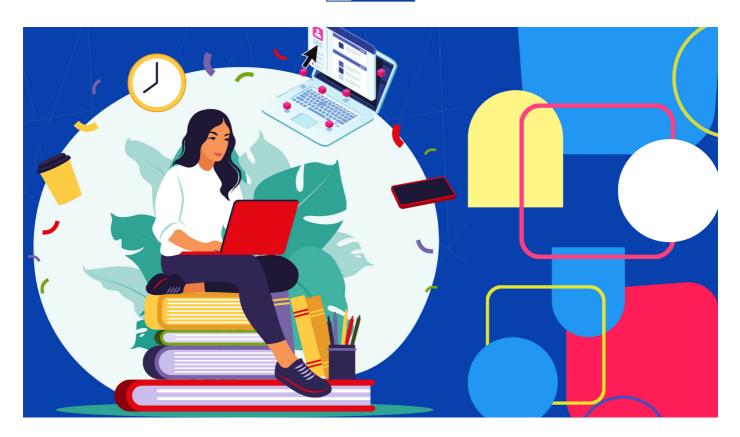
