


OBJECTIVE PERSONAL PRONOUN

Objective personal pronoun is a group of words in English that take the place of nouns when we want to refer to someone or something that is receiving the action of a verb or is the object of a preposition. They are like the sidekicks of the sentence, always there to help out! The most common objective pronouns are "me," "you," "him," "her," "it," "us," and "them."
