


PASSIVE SENTENCE

When the subject of a sentence has something done by someone, we call it a passive sentence. In passive sentences, you will find the emphasis on the receiver or object of action rather than the duer. This kind of sentence is always formed by using the helping or auxiliary verb "to be" followed by the past participle.


