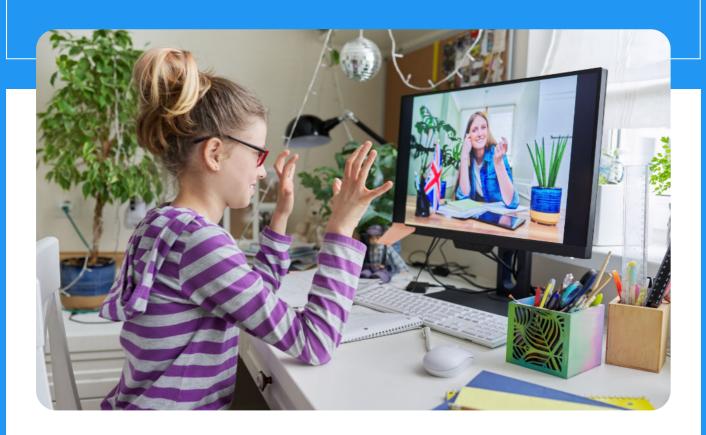


PERFECT TENSE

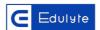

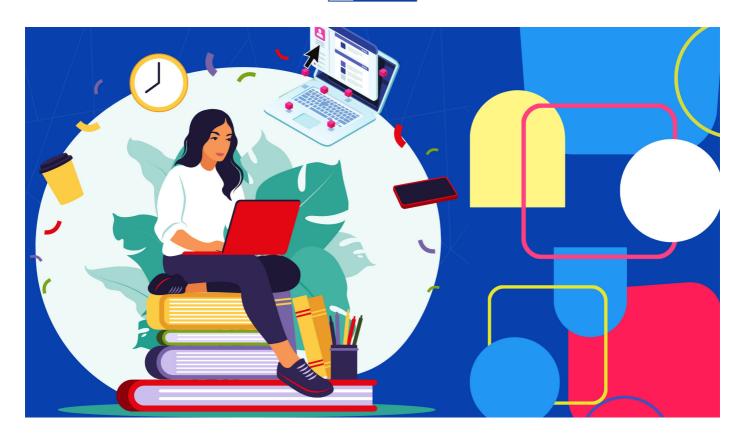
