


SPLIT INFINITIVE

It is very easy to define split infinitive. A split infinitive is when you use an extra adverb between a simple infinitive in English grammar. Generally, a split infinitive is considered an error and consists of an additional word between a simple infinitive. Some people also say splitting an infinitive is not a mistake and adds more meaning to the sentence and the verb.


