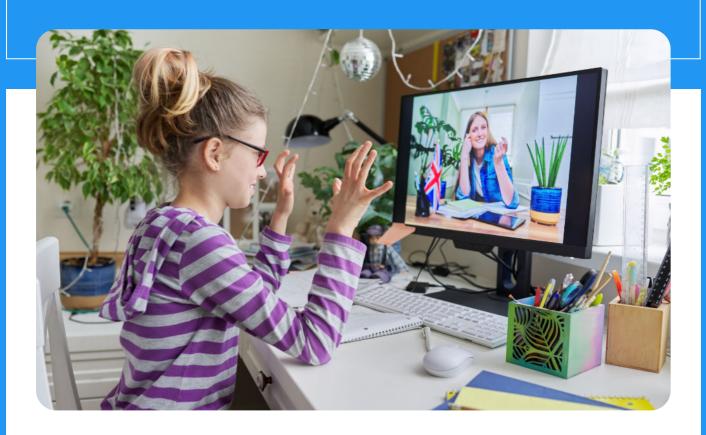


# **WEAK VERBS**

Weak verbs are those whose past tense and past participle form conjugate with the addition of 'ed', 't', or d to the end of the root verb. These verbs added to the verb stem indicate person, number, tense, and mood.

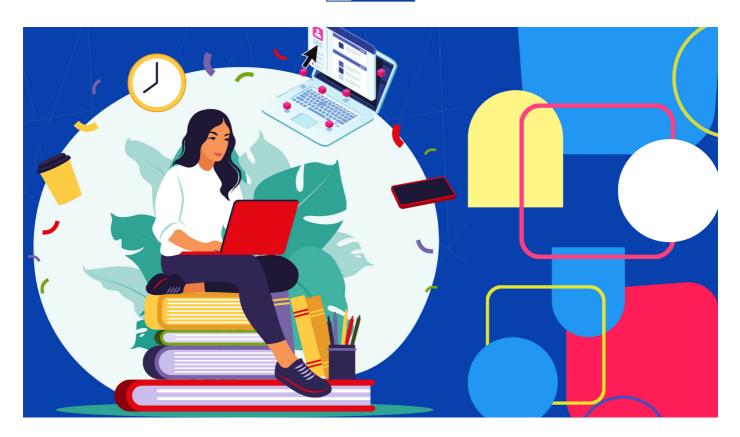
